Hackle Rally 13th March 2027

Welcome to the consultation document for the local community, residents, businesses and stakeholders, in relation to the 2027 Hackle Rally

The 2027 Hackle Rally will be held on 13th March 2027

The event comprises closed road Special Stages* held on roads around Perthshire. The event will be held under The Motor Sport on Public Roads (Scotland) Regulations 2019, which allows public roads to be closed for the purposes of motor sport following consultation and approval by Motorsport UK and Perth & Kinross Council

This document is designed to provide initial details of the planned route for the 2027 Hackle Rally to all those that may be affected by the event and the resultant road closures, and to seek the views of all stakeholders prior to any plans being finalised. Within this document are maps showing what roads will be closed along with the times of the closures over the three days of the rally. The roads shown in red on each map indicate section of road will be closed, and each section has a stage reference number (e.g. SS1) and a stage name (e.g. Foss Road)

Please always note from the maps that we have endeavoured to ensure that there are always alternative routes between villages and towns.

Three of the proposed stages are devoid of habitation, the two stages with houses will have additional attention to ensure emergency access and the like is provided for.

The Hackle Rally is historically connected to Perthshire, previously having been run by 55 Car Club in the 70's / 80's as a forest rally. 55 Car Club was incorporated into the Saltire Rally Club in 2024, hence the reason we resurrect the name and respect the history of motor sport in Perthshire.

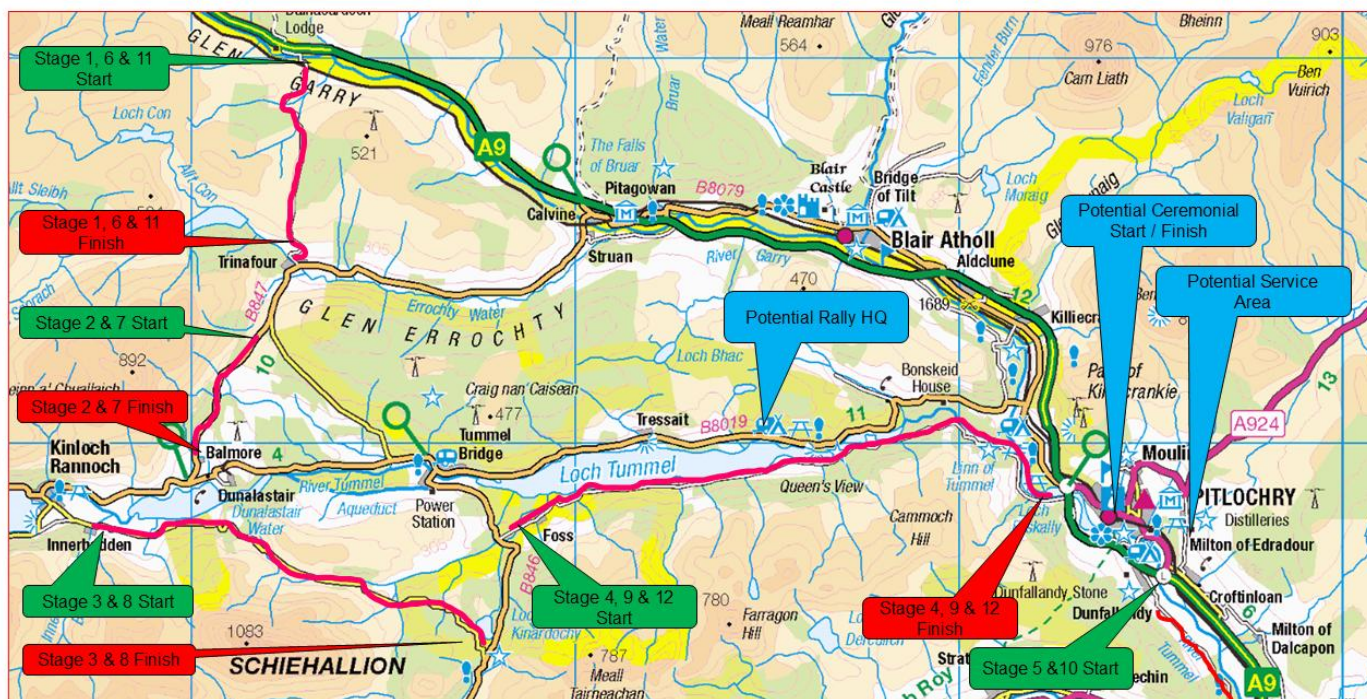

Thank you to all the members who made this possible.

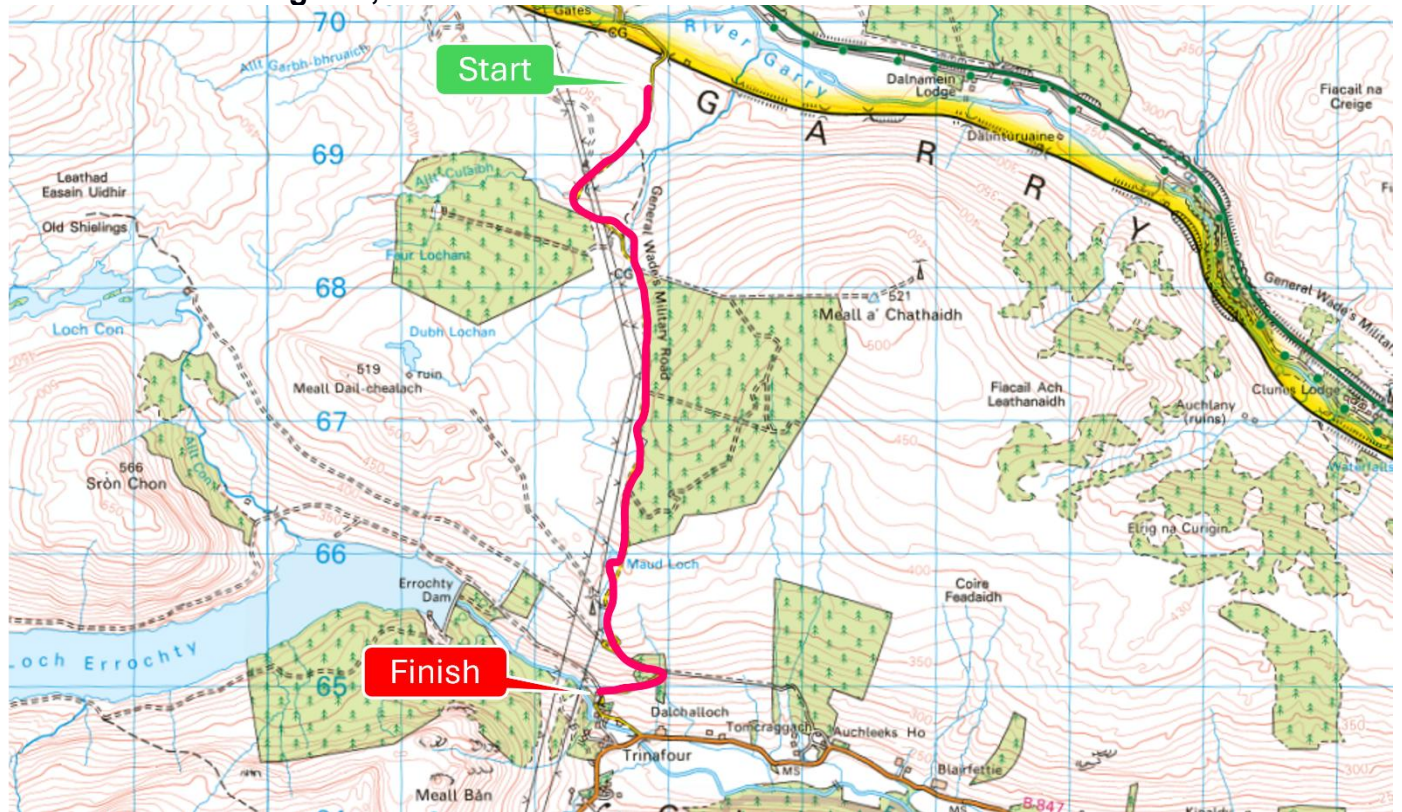

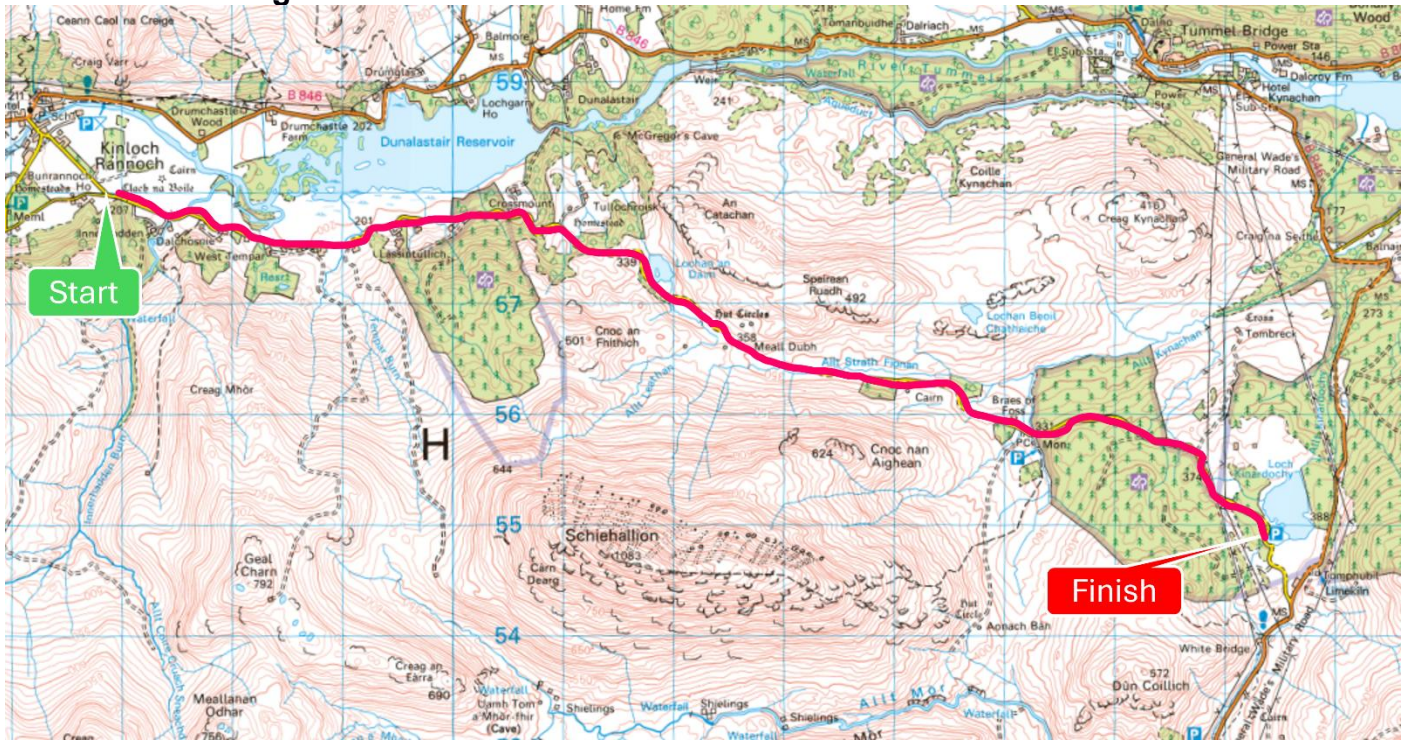
Dalnacardoch - Stages 1, 6 & 11



Balmore - Stages 2 & 7



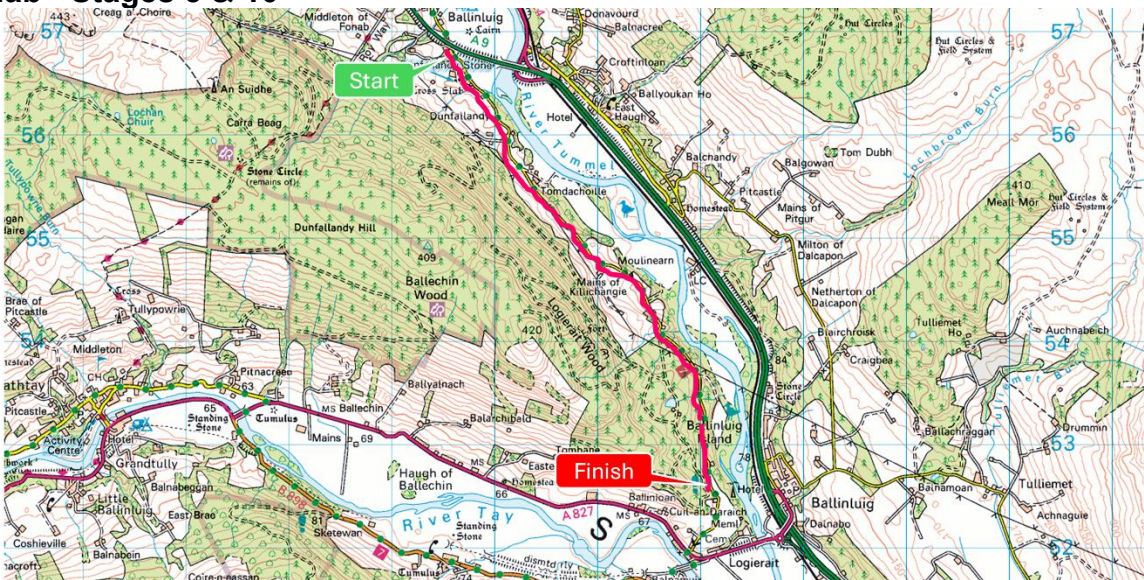
Schiehallion - Stages 3 & 8
